Who A history of Emotions in Nursing

From birth to death and everything in between, health is closely associated with a range of emotions. But who cares for the carers?



This exhibition explores how the emotions attached to nursing, and the assumptions underlying these feelings, have changed throughout history.

During the last 150 years, nursing has been shaped by ideas about class, race and gender, as well as shifts in practice and politics. Discover Florence Nightingale's bible, Edith Cavell's last letter and scrapbooks from conflict zones. The exhibition includes a stained-glass window by artist Rachel Mulligan, created in collaboration with nurses from around the UK, showing care at every stage of life.

You Mean the World: Nursing in a climate crisis

14 November 2024-13 April 2025 Lower Ground Floor, Library and Museum

Nursing staff are on the frontline of the climate crisis. They see its impact first hand – from diseases linked to air pollution to the damaging effects of extreme heat.

The NHS has committed to being carbon neutral by 2045, but there is a long way to go. As the largest part of the health and care workforce, it is crucial that nursing becomes more sustainable.

This exhibition explores the history of air pollution and of recycling and re-use in nursing and shows how talented nursing teams are taking climate action today – from green social prescribing to developing sustainable nursing tools. Highlights include an art installation by Lisa Ward Morris, and designs from 'PPE Refashioned' – a project to create sustainable gowns for health care staff by Nottingham School of Art and Design.
